found differences in textbook and studying style. They have group work and presentation. In


Japan, there is no group work and the teacher is not strict.

In the Afternoon...



Challenge the traditional way:



Komodo dragon



So I thought that it was very important that each country had each good point.




I introduce KRUPUK. It is the simple cooking that we only fry in oil. We can by it on the internet. Everybody, please eat, too!
